JAMs offers crucial mentorship to teenagers residing in foster care at Hope Village. Junior Auxiliary of Meridian reaffirms its dedication to serving every child in our community through its steadfast, ongoing connection with the teens at Hope Village. Throughout the year, JAMs actively supports Hope Village's mission by delivering stability, consistency, and encouragement through enjoyable activities that also impart vital life skills like financial literacy, gardening, etiquette, and promoting healthy living.













### Helping Hands

Helping Hands ensures that area children receive essential items throughout the school year. We collaborate with local school counselors to identify and meet student needs, including uniforms, eye exams, glasses, and shoes. During the 2022-2023 school year, we fulfilled over 300 requests for school uniforms, a testament to our goal of fostering a positive outlook among children by providing proper clothing and footwear for the school environment. Additionally, we extended a helping hand to our neighbors in Amory following the devastating tornado, donating 60 packs of baby wipes, 450 garbage bags, 100 tote bags, 75 pairs of work gloves, and over 75 bundles of newspapers.

### **Educator Mini Grants**

JA of Meridian recognizes the importance of education as an essential building block for a strong and thriving community. Creating, supporting, and nurturing innovative educational projects is essential for community development and progression. Teachers, counselors, and librarians who work in schools in Meridian and Lauderdale County have the opportunity to apply for a grant that ranges from \$250-\$1,000. The grant applications are scored as follows: using innovative and creative methods of instruction, integrating conventional instruction with other forms of teaching, instruction being incorporated in the regular curriculum, having significant instructional value, and having a positive effect on student attitude and behavior.

Each year our Provisional Class develops a service project based on a community need. The 2022-2023 Provisional Class created the beYOUty Shop project. A self-esteem building workshop using hair care as a focal point, this project was geared toward building self-esteem and confidence while teaching important self-care skills to local middle school students. The beYOUty Shop was held at Northeast Middle School on April 4th, 2023, and students were taught about hair care and provided with essential products to take home by several generous community business donors.

Junior Auxiliary of Meridian's Crown Club offers high school young ladies a chance to cultivate their character through community service. This class encompasses sophomore, junior, and senior young women from local high schools. Nominations for potential members of the Crown Club of Meridian can be made by Active, Associate, and Lifetime members of Junior Auxiliary, as well as school guidance counselors, who believe they would be exemplary candidates. Crown Club members participate in monthly service, mentor, and professional development opportunities.

### Hearts for the Arts - Crown Club Project

Hearts for the Arts aims to expand, support, and enhance opportunities for youth arts education in the community. The project began with an arts supply drive benefiting the classroom needs of local educators and continues with arts-related areas of focus each year. This project has reached our community in numerous ways, including a World Arts Day Festival, and a permanent Art Walk Trail in downtown Meridian, featuring the artistic creations of local youth.
